
Spring Higan Service

Literary, Higan means the "Other Shore (of the Buddha)" as opposed to Shigan which means "This Shore (of Suffering and Pain)." Higan service is a time for us to offer prayer of gratitude to all the loved ones of the family and ancestors. Without spiritual life of connectedness to our ancestors we would not be what we are today.

Please bring your children, grandchildren and even great grandchildren to the service to teach them the importance of learning about one's identity from this perspective. The Fujinkai members will be making botamochi, a Japanese Sweet made of mochi rice wrapped in sweetened azuki beans. It's very delicious so please come and enjoy this treat with us. If you can come as early as 8:00am, please help the ladies make the botamochi.


